## FMLE Learner Assessment of Clinical Teacher (LACT)

Teaching effectiveness scores (TES) for the Department of Medicine are captured and maintained in the Medical Student Information System (MedSIS) for MD program teaching. MD and PGME learners use the Learner Assessment of Clinical Teachers (LACT) tool to evaluate teaching in clinical environments.

We encourage all faculty to review their Undergraduate teaching effectiveness scores in MedSIS to get feedback on their teaching activities and to help prepare their teaching dossiers for review and promotion.

**To access your TES, you will need to login to [MedSIS](#):**

**Login:** (either via your PIN and password, or via your UTORid, if it was previously enabled for MedSIS)

After logging in, select TES Score from the left-hand menu. (If TES is not visible, you may need to first click **Supervisor Tasks** on the left-hand menu)

**Select Session, Course and Form from the drop-down lists:**

- Session: Select Year
- Course: [LONCOMP2] Longitudinal Components
- Form: Learner Assessment of Clinical Teacher (LACT)

If there is a published TES report available for the selected criteria, the report will appear. It is important to review all sessions (years), courses and forms (course components) that you have taught in. TES reports in MedSIS are only available after they are reviewed and published by the course director.

**Note:** TES data can only be provided once 3 or more evaluations have been completed for a specific session/course and form. This is to protect student anonymity. As of 2022-2023 all FMLE Preceptor LACT forms were made **mandatory** for students, to ensure our preceptors continue to receive consistent feedback on their teaching.
